Logline:

Putting food sovereignty to the test in Canada's North

Synopsis Short:

What happens when an ordinary family, living just south of the Arctic Circle, bans all grocery store food from their house for one year? Add three skeptical teenagers, one reluctant husband, no salt, no caffeine, no sugar and -40 temperatures.

Synopsis Medium:

Putting food sovereignty to the test in the far North of Canada - filmmaker Suzanne Crocker, living just 300 km from the Arctic Circle, removes absolutely all grocery store food from her house.

For one year, she feeds her family of five, only food that can be hunted, fished, gathered, grown or raised around Dawson City, Yukon on the traditional territory of the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in.

Add three skeptical teenagers, one reluctant husband, no salt, no caffeine, no sugar and -40 temperatures.

Ultimately the story becomes a celebration of community and the surprising bounty of food that even a tiny community in the far North can provide.

Director's Bio:

Yukon filmmaker and award-winning director Suzanne Crocker has become known for turning her camera on herself and her family as she takes them through some rather extreme adventure/experiments.

Suzanne's previous feature doc, All The Time In The World (2014) won 22 Festival Awards from around the world. Translated into 12 languages. <https://allthetimeintheworld.ca>

Suzanne turns her camera on herself and her family once again in their latest adventure, First We Eat, winner of 6 Audience Choice Awards including Hot Docs and long-listed for Best Documentary at the 2021 Oscars.

Suzanne switched careers from rural family doctor to filmmaker in 2008.
